

The Department of Communication at the University of Maryland is seeking to hire full or part-time lecturers for the 2017-2018 academic year. The successful candidates are expected to teach undergraduate courses in Communication. A review of applications will begin May 20, 2017.

First, we are seeking individuals who could teach courses in public relations. These courses include writing and editing for public relations, public relations principles and practices, public relations campaigns, and/or public relations cases. Professional experience in public relations is desired.

Second, we are seeking individuals to teach courses in communication science. These courses include: quantitative and qualitative social science research methods as well as communication theory and processes.

Third, we are seeking individuals to teach courses in visual digital communication. These courses include graphic design, video production, writing for visual media, writing for the web, cinematography, and/or social media. Professional experience in video production is desired.

Fourth, we are seeking an individual who could teach organizational communication.

The starting date is August 15, 2017. Teaching experience in higher education is expected. An M.A. degree is required, Ph.D. preferred.

The University is located in the Washington, DC, metropolitan area. Campus is accessible through the Washington, DC metro system and by campus and city buses. The University of Maryland is located in the vicinity of the National Archives, several research libraries, and many governmental institutions. In addition, the department has established a Center for Political Communication and Civic Leadership as well as a Center for Health and Risk Communication.

Women and minorities are particularly encouraged to apply.
